NO EASY ANSWERS

We're all familiar with the trap the Herodians and the Pharisees set for Jesus, asking whether it was right for a Jew to pay allegiance to Caesar. Jesus must have been making a strong impact because this alliance between Herodians and Pharisees (who hated each other) was such an unlikely one. We all know Jesus' answer: "give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar - and to God what belongs to God." We live side by side with two kingdoms: the kingdom of secular government and the kingdom of God. Week by week, month by month, we find ourselves faced with circumstances where one conflicts with the other. e.g., we recognise the State's right to levy taxes, but we might have problems with the sort of medical or social services they provide with the money they raise. We recognise our right to defend ourselves, but we might have trouble with wars and campaigns that our governments lead us into. Christians say that there is nothing that does not belong to God, so God must come first in all things. When earthly authority is opposed to what we believe is God's authority how do we react? In this regard our conscience can seem to be both a blessing and a curse because we cannot blindly follow rules and regulations; our

consciences (if they are correctly formed) should compel us to act in accordance with what we believe to be God's will for humanity. Today's reading is a classic

example of how the gospel does not seem to provide us with all the answers. The good news is good news, but it also challenges us to be just as adult about the things

of God as we have become about the things of Caesar. And vice versa.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading: A reading from the prophet Isaiah [45:1. 4-6]

I have taken Cyrus by his right hand to subdue nations before him.

Thus says the Lord to his anointed, to Cyrus, whom he has taken by his right hand to subdue nations before him and strip the loins of kings, to force gateways before him that their gates be closed no more: It is for the sake of my servant Jacob, of Israel my chosen one, that I have called you by your name, conferring a title though you do not know me. I am the Lord, unrivalled; there is no other God besides me. Though you do not know me, I arm you that men may know from the rising to the setting of the sun that, apart from me, all is nothing.

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Responsorial Psalm [Ps 95:1. 3-5. 7-10]

Response: Give the Lord glory and power.

O sing a new song to the Lord, sing to the Lord all the earth. Tell among the nations his glory and his wonders among all the peoples.

The Lord is great and worthy of praise, to be feared above all gods; the gods of the heathens are naught. It was the Lord who made the heavens.

Give the Lord, you families of peoples, give the Lord glory and power, give the Lord the glory of his name. Bring an offering and enter his courts

Worship the Lord in his temple. O earth, tremble before him. Proclaim to the nations: 'God is king.' He will judge the peoples in fairness.



Second Reading: A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians [1:1-5]

We constantly remember your faith, your love and your hope.

From Paul, Silvanus and Timothy, to the Church in Thessalonika which is in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ; wishing you grace and peace from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. We always mention you in our prayers and thank God for you all, and constantly remember before God our Father how you have shown your faith in action, worked for love and persevered through hope, in our Lord Jesus Christ. We know, brothers, that God loves you and that you have been chosen, because when we brought the Good News to you, it came to you not only as words, but as power and as the Holy Spirit and as utter conviction.

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Alleluia, alleluia! Your word is truth, O Lord, consecrate us in the truth. Alleluia!

Gospel: A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew [22:15-21]

Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar - and to God what belongs to God.

The Pharisees went away to work out between them how to trap Jesus in what he said. And they sent their disciples to him, together with the Herodians, to say, 'Master, we know that you are an honest man and teach the way of God in an honest way, and that you are not afraid of anyone, because a man's rank means nothing to you. Tell us your opinion, then. Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?' But Jesus was aware of their malice and replied, 'You hypocrites! Why do you set this trap for me? Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he said, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar - and to God what belongs to God.'

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
