First Reading: A reading from the book of Deuteronomy [4:32 – 34, 39 – 40]

The Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, he and no other. Has any god ventured to take to himself one nation from the midst of another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors – all this that the Lord your God did for you before your eyes in Egypt?

Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today so that you and your children may prosper and live long in the land that the Lord your God gives you for ever.'
