#### **BE BACK SOON!**

THE END 15 NIGH People have constantly predicted the end of the world and the second coming of Christ. At the time of St Paul there was a widespread belief that Jesus would return during their lifetime. A century later Hippolytus calculated that Jesus would return in 500AD. In 968 Otto's army panicked at an eclipse that they took to signify the end of the world. For the first millennium, 1000AD, people got frightened again thinking it would be the end of the world. 1666 was a famous year for predictions, because of the plague and the Great Fire of London. (Not to mention the 666 element). After several hastily rescheduled predictions of the end of the world by the Jehovah's Witnesses in the 1970s we had to put up with all the hysteria that surrounded the start of the second millennium. In the face of all of this, Jesus is very clear: "But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father." Nobody knows it. Nobody. Part of the reason for this failure to understand the nature of Christ's preaching about the end of time is because of the language used in his apocalyptic teachings, which uses a lot of symbolism. His hearers would not have taken literally the idea of the sun being darkened, the moon losing its brightness and the stars falling out of the sky. They knew it was a way of creating an effect when preaching, of disclosing material to those in the know while at the same time hiding the meaning from others. Apocalyptic writing contains huge amounts of symbolism, dreams and imagery that has to be interpreted by the code-breaker before it can be understood. So, when we hear of famines, epidemics, terrorist attacks, global warming or earthquakes how do we react? If we think that this is a sign of the end of the world or the 2<sup>nd</sup> coming of Christ then we might as well join all the other failed predictors of history. Rather than worrying about impending doom, wouldn't we be better off preparing to meet our God by living the sort of lives that Jesus taught us before that unknown time arrives.


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## Responsorial Psalm [Ps 15:5. 8-11]

# Gospel: A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark [13:24-32]

He will gather his chosen from the four winds.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'In those days, after that time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven.

'Take the fig tree as a parable: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. So with you when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. 'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.

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
